## FARM CASH RECEIPTS ESTIMATES\* JANUARY – SEPTEMBER 2006<sup>R</sup> - 2011<sup>P</sup>

In the first nine months of 2011 in Manitoba, total farm cash receipts were \$3.67 billion, an increase of 1.3% from 2010. Revenues from the sale of crops and livestock were \$3.32 billion, down 0.2% from the same period one year earlier.

From January to September 2011, crop revenues were \$1.95 billion, a drop of 6.0% from the same period in 2010, primarily due to reduced marketings despite higher prices for most grains and oilseeds. Tight carry-in stocks in the US and globally, combined with a 2 to 3% increase in world demand for grains and oilseeds, has supported an across the board strengthening in prices. This situation is likely to continue for the near-term, supporting continued strength in market prices. The excess moisture situation combined with dry conditions in the latter part of the growing season, have pressured market supplies and limits the province's ability to capitalize on world supply conditions.

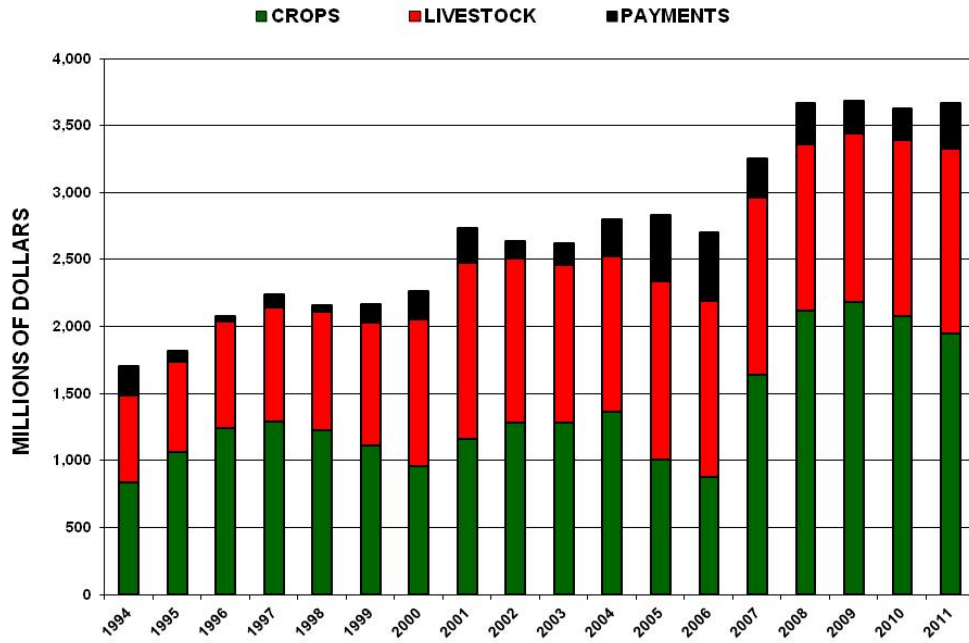
Livestock revenues in the 2011 period rose 4.3% from the 2010 period to reach \$1.38 billion. This improvement in revenues is attributable to strong market prices for cattle as demand for protein continues to grow both nationally and internationally. Cattle prices rose 14% over the first three quarters of 2011. However, excess moisture conditions in the province may have had a negative impact on slaughter supplies, pressuring overall receipts. Prices continue to be strong in the hog sector in 2011, up 8% from 2010, although marketings decreased slightly by just over 1%. This can be attributed in part to a small retrenching in on-farm stocks and corresponding drop in slaughter.

Program payments in the first nine months of 2010 were \$347.5 million, up 50.1% from the same nine month period one year ago.

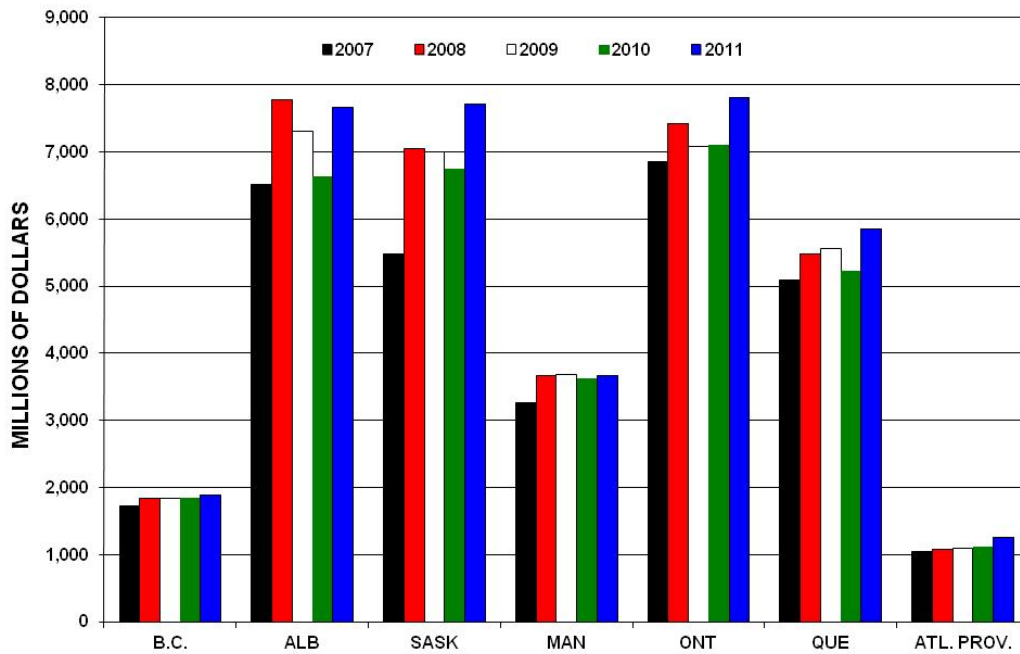
### FARM CASH RECEIPTS ESTIMATES MANITOBA, January-September, 1994-2011
