OVERVIEW:

On June 19, 1996, the Department received a Proposal dated June 17, 1996, prepared by the Town of Grandview, for the construction of a temporary dewatering cell at the site of the wastewater treatment lagoon and the removal of sludge solids from a wastewater treatment lagoon located on the south half of Section 25, Township 25, Range 24 WPM. The Department received a revised Proposal on August 15, 1996. The revised Proposal indicated that the sludge solids are to be removed from the wastewater treatment lagoon, dewatered in a temporary cell and hauled to the local waste disposal ground located on the southeast quarter of Section 31, Township 25, Range 23 WPM in the Rural Municipality of Grandview.

The Department, on August 26, 1996, placed copies of the Proposal in the Public Registries located at Building 2, 139 Tuxedo Avenue; the Centennial Public Library; and the Dauphin Public Library and provided copies of the Proposal to the Interdepartmental Planning Board and TAC members. As well, the Department placed a public notification of the Proposal in the Grandview Exponent on Wednesday, September 4, 1996. The newspaper and TAC notification invited responses until September 18, 1996.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC:

No public responses were received.

COMMENTS FROM THE TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE:

Highways - No concerns.

Natural Resources - No concerns.

Historic Resources - No concerns.

Rural Development - No concerns.

Environment-Operations Division

- The temporary cell should be constructed to prevent loss of wastewater;
- Sludge solids should be transported in such a manner to prevent loss or spillage;
- Sludge deposited at the waste disposal ground should be:
 - incorporated into topsoil, or
 - covered with soil in an area separate from the active area.

Disposition:

Draft Licence includes a clause which addresses these concerns.

Environment-Water Quality Management - No concerns provided the sludge effluent is directed back into the lagoon and does not find its way into the Valley River.

Disposition:

Draft Licence includes a clause which addresses this concern.

Canadian Environmental Assessment Agency - CEAA has indicated that application of *The Canadian Environmental Assessment Act* with respect to this proposal will not be required.

PUBLIC HEARING:

A public hearing is not required.

RECOMMENDATION:

A Licence be issued in accordance with the attached draft. Enforcement of the Licence should be assigned to the Park-West Region.
