Re: Requirements for storage and dispensing petroleum and or allied products from transport vehicles at remote job locations

Sections 7(2) and 7(3) of Manitoba Regulation 188/2001, the *Storage and Handling of Petroleum Products and Allied Products Regulation*, deal with the storage and dispensing of petroleum and / or allied products from transport vehicles at remote job locations, and the approval requirements for each.

Pursuant to the above noted sections of the Regulation, the owner of petroleum storage tanks must obtain departmental approval in order to store and dispense petroleum or allied products from a transport vehicle, subject to the following conditions being met:

- The transport vehicle(s) in question must be tested and meet the requirements set out in CSA Standard B620-1998, Highway Tanks and Portable Tanks for the Transportation of Dangerous Goods as amended, revised or replaced from time to time and must be marked with metal tags as specified in CSA B620;
- The vehicle(s) must be situated no closer than 150 metres from a waterway or well, unless otherwise approved by the district Environment Officer;
- The vehicle(s) must not be situated in an area that may be considered environmentally sensitive and where a release or spill of petroleum or allied products may result in irreversible environmental damage;
- The vehicle(s) must be equipped with adequate supplies to contain and recover any spills of petroleum or allied products;
- The vehicle(s) must be licensed and insured for transport on public roads in Manitoba;
- The vehicle, including transport tanks, must meet the requirements of *Transportation of Dangerous Goods Act* including, but not necessarily limited to, placards, documentation and training requirements.

The owner and / or operator of the vehicle is responsible for ensuring compliance with the requirements described above and all other applicable provisions of Manitoba Regulation 188/2001.

Please note that an environment officer may, upon inspection, issue further site specific requirements above those mentioned in this approval.
