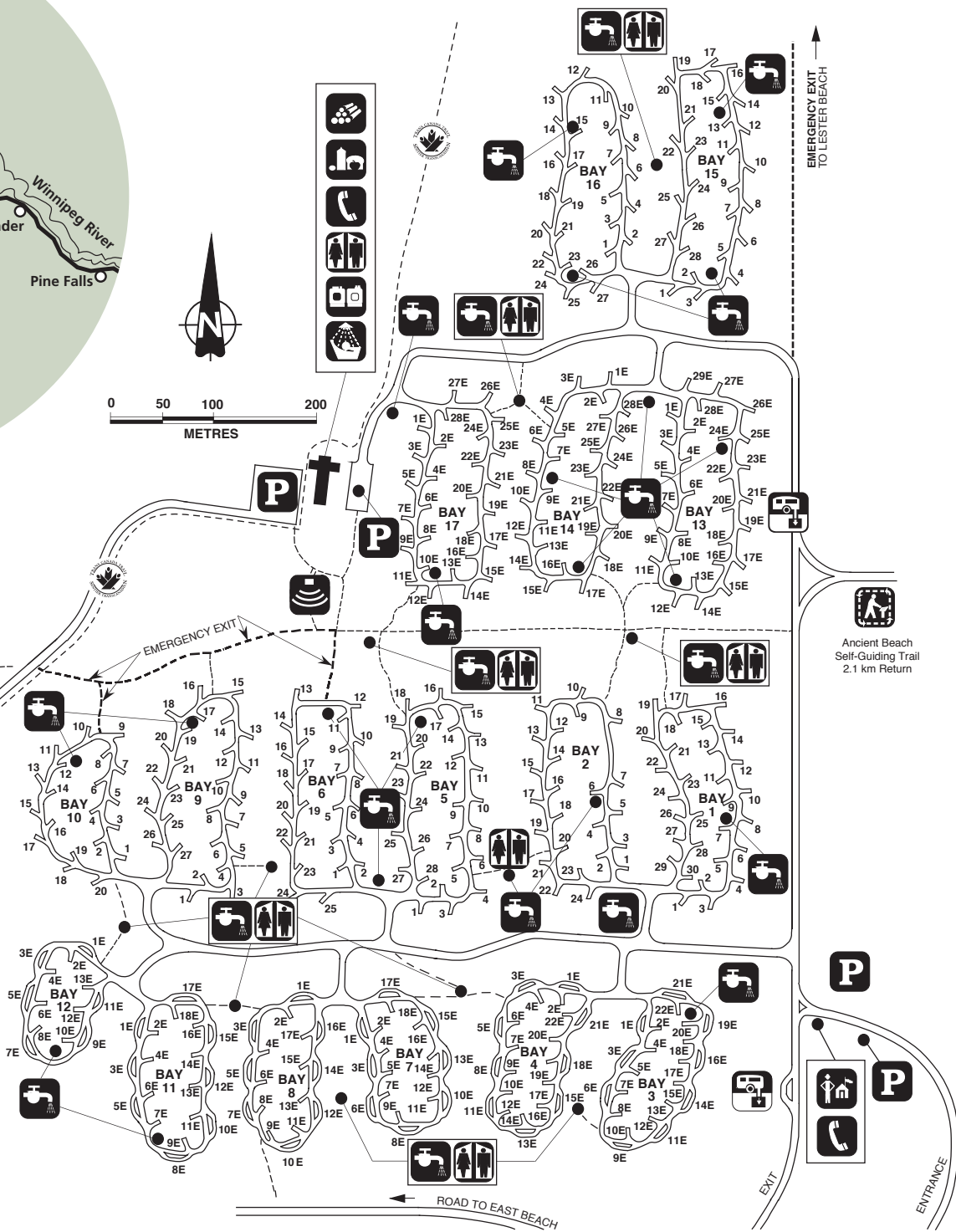
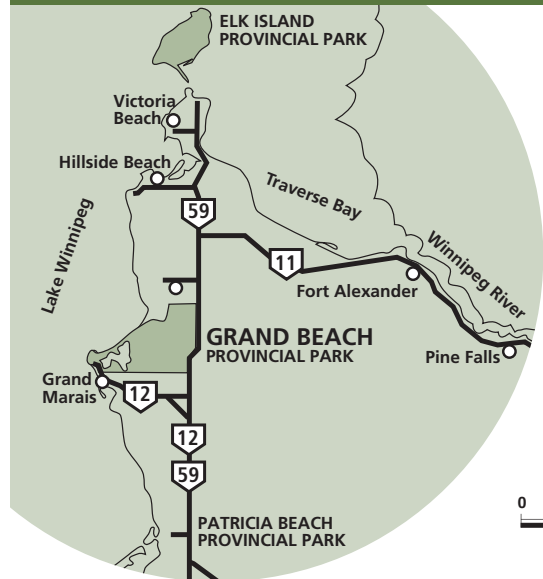

Campground Tips

- Be sure matches are extinguished. Break them in half before discarding.
- Build no fires except in a designated firepit or use a camp stove. Before leaving make sure your fire is completely out.
- Be careful with your cigarettes, cigars and pipe ashes. Crush them thoroughly before discarding. Never toss them from a vehicle.
- Please! Do not litter.
- Be sensitive to wildlife. Bears can be dangerous and should not be fed. Food must be stored away from your campsite, preferably in a locked vehicle, to avoid attracting hungry animals. Do not store food in your tent.
- Warm clothing is needed for cool nights.
- The use of insect repellent will add to your comfort.
- Learn to recognize and avoid poisonous plants such as poison ivy.
- In case of injury or illness contact a Campground Attendant or Park Patrol Officer. They can assist you to reach medical help.
- Canoeists and hikers travelling in backcountry areas should advise a friend of their intended destination and anticipated length of trip.
- Camping is only allowed at designated campsites.
- It is illegal to use or transport elm firewood.
- Out of Province Firewood can spread harmful pests and destroy our forests - buy it locally, burn it locally.

Grand Beach

- Dunes 12 metres high and kilometres of inviting warm sand beach



One of the best beaches in North America is located in Grand Beach Provincial Park and is the first choice for those who love hot sun, blue skies, and relaxation. The 3-kilometre stretch of fine silica sand, with its rolling dunes reaching up to 12 m in height, is a perfect haven for sun-worshippers. Nearby, the Grand Beach campground offers over 350 campsites with a combination of electrical and basic camping opportunities.

Grand Beach has been a tradition since the days of the carousel, the dance hall and train rides to the beach in the 1920s. Nowadays, nature's strong summer potion of sun, sand and water draws thousands of people from miles around. Days are filled with leisurely swims, strolls along the boardwalk, beach volleyball, and sand castle creations. Brightly coloured sails of surfers drift by on the warm winds. A natural lagoon offers a world of adventure for children and adults alike. Hundreds of birds make up a kaleidoscope of colour and song. The calm waters are ideal for waterskiing, boardsailing and boating. Don't miss the chance to explore the backstage landscape, carved from the ice age, now offering gentle inclines, berry-filled forests and raw rocky ridges.

Dunes 12 metres high and kilometres of inviting warm sand beach receive the gentle waves of the great prairie sea. The beach is located on Lake

Winnipeg, the sixth largest lake in Canada. Grand Beach is one of few places where the endangered Piping Plover lives. Interpretive tours can teach you about the birds, and why it is important to protect them. Away from the beach, find a different world of a jack pine forest, spruce bog and a large lagoon.

"Ancient Beach" and "Wild Wings" self-guiding trails take visitors to special places within the park that don't always get the attention that they deserve. Take an interpretive tour and explore how the landscape came to be, or follow a trail to see a multitude of birds and wildlife at the marsh.

Although the beach is the focal point of the park, there are other activities to keep you busy throughout your vacation. In addition to the trails, other activities which are available include tennis, volleyball, waterskiing, boardsailing, boating, fishing and golf.

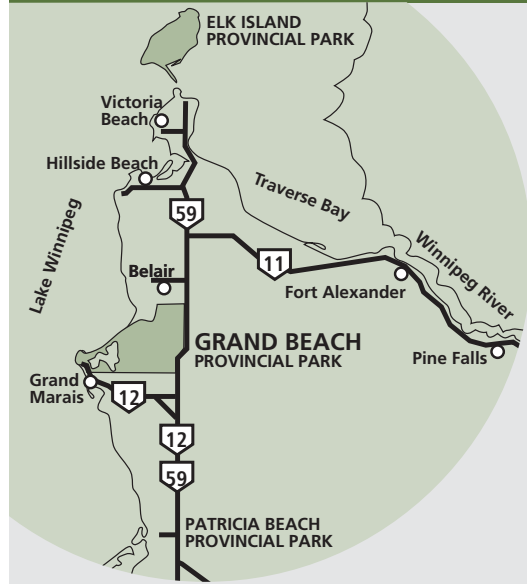

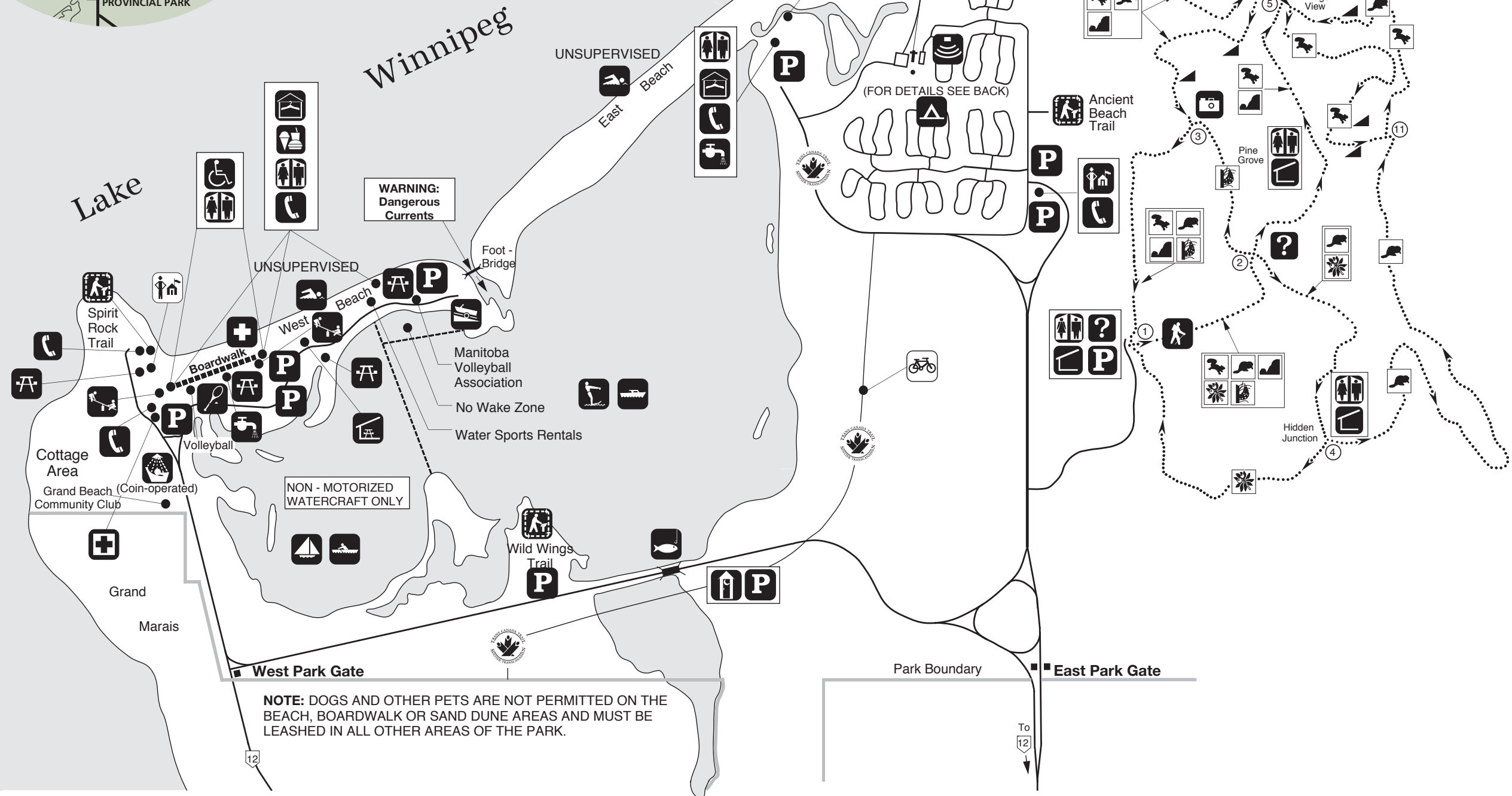
