

St. Malo Provincial Park—Public Consultation and Facilities Study

The Manitoba Government has contracted Republic Architecture Inc. to undertake a public consultation process aimed at outlining development options for potential improvements to St. Malo Provincial Park.

St. Malo Provincial Park is one of the busiest in Manitoba's system of parks. It has two well-utilized beach areas and 454 serviced and basic campsites.

This public engagement process is being undertaken to better understand park users' needs, and how new or renewed infrastructure will support current and future user activities.

Methods of engaging the public include:

- *One-On-One Stakeholder Meetings*—Ongoing. Approximately eight (8) discussions have been undertaken to date and will continue throughout the process.
- *Survey* (paper and online)—Closed November 30, 2011. Completed surveys in both English and French were received from 316 respondents.
- *Workshop*—Held November 17, 2011 at 6:30 pm at the Dufrost Community Hall in Dufrost, MB. Approximately 24 people from the general public were in attendance.
- *Report*—In early 2012, The Manitoba Government will have a draft report prepared by Republic Architecture Inc. for review. Once completed, the executive summary of this report will be posted at www.manitoba.ca/conservation/parks for public viewing.
