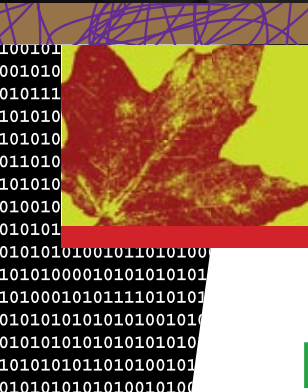
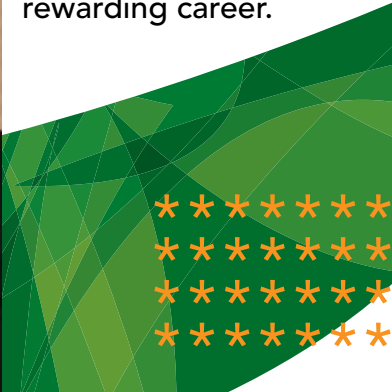


# Aboriginal Public Administration Program (APAP)

The Manitoba government offers you opportunity, diversity and a rewarding career.



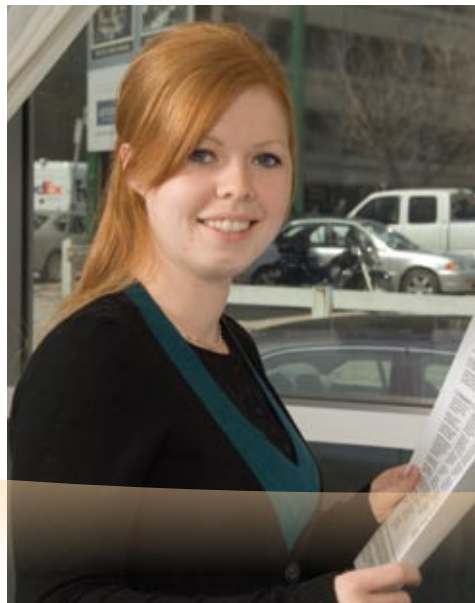
## What is APAP?

The Aboriginal Public Administration Program is a two-year development program that prepares Aboriginal people for an exciting and rewarding career with the Manitoba government.

The goal of APAP is to increase the number of Aboriginal people working for the Manitoba government.

The program includes ongoing and practical training, combined with job placements in multiple government departments. These include financial and human resource services, program and project management, research and policy analysis.

At the end of the program, you will have developed your skills and be equipped with knowledge about how government works, which will enable you to apply for a variety of positions within government.



## What are the benefits to you?

You will:

- develop your leadership skills
- learn about government processes and systems
- make a difference in your community
- contribute to the future of Manitoba
- be prepared and eligible to apply for jobs throughout government

## Who is eligible?

Participants must be Aboriginal (First Nations, Metis, Non-Status or Inuit).

Successful candidates will:

- have a post-secondary degree, diploma, or certificate with a public sector focus, or have an equivalent combination of education and experience
- have excellent oral and written communications skills
- have excellent interpersonal and leadership skills
- have knowledge of Aboriginal issues, cultures and languages
- understand and value diversity in the workplace
- have an interest in working for the Manitoba government
