MONTROSE SCHOOL	This year we have had many whole school activities such as a Move-a-Thon, Bowling Day, Winter Fun Day etc., which have focused on establishing healthy relationships. We will also have a culminating year-end activity with multi-age group activities.
MULVEY SCHOOL	We recognize students who perform acts of kindness to others. At school wide assemblies students are recognized for Random Acts of Kindness where they are acknowledged in front of the entire student body and receive a small token of recognition.
NORQUAY SCHOOL	Book Buddies consist of the older grade classrooms partnering up with a younger grade class. The students get together and read with each other. A snack will allow them more quality time to be spent with each other.
PRAIRIE ROSE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL	We will be holding a Chinese New year's lunch.
PRINCIPAL SPARLING SCHOOL	Within individual classrooms teachers will teach the qualities of good friendship. Then school wide we will have adults working at the school and the Peacekeepers who are on at recess duty give ballots to students who demonstrate friendship.
