Milner Ridge Correctional Centre

Milner Ridge Correctional Centre (MRCC) is a medium/maximum security facility located southeast of Beausejour, Manitoba in the Agassiz Provincial Forest. It houses about 524 sentenced and remanded adult male offenders and has six campus-style living units, two large direct supervision units and a dorm building.

Programs

Correctional staff focus on offenders' personal development through group interaction, educational opportunities, vocational training, work experience and individual counselling. These programs are offered at MRCC:

- · academics
- thinking awareness group
- domestic violence intervention
- end to aggression/anger management
- addictions recovery/Coming to Terms
- Triple P parenting
- Alcoholics Anonymous and Narcotics Anonymous
- Culturally Appropriate Program

Program officers facilitate programs and case counselling.

Work Programs

Offenders can earn valuable work experience in the following areas:

- · kitchen work
- · grounds keeping
- · carpentry
- graphic arts
- cleaning/stores/laundry

Other Activities

There are cross-cultural awareness and Aboriginal spirituality programs. Chaplains and Aboriginal spiritual caregivers provide spiritual care at the centre. Volunteer services include bible study, visiting events and tutoring for offenders.

Staff

Staff include correctional officers, trades instructors, nurses, chaplains, Aboriginal spiritual caregivers, managers and administrative staff. Correctional officers work 12-hour shifts, providing 24-hour coverage, seven days a week.



Corrections staff must work as part of a team, using sound judgment and a mature, common-sense approach to decision-making and inmate interventions. Candidates will take the correctional officer/juvenile counsellors screening tests. The tests assess written skills, problem-solving and decision-making abilities, judgement and other personal characteristics important for correctional staff.

If you are selected for correctional officer/juvenile counsellor training, you must:

- Submit a recent Criminal Records Search Certificate.*
- Submit Child Abuse and Adult Abuse Registry Checks.
- Submit Emergency or Standard First Aid and CPR Level C certificates.
- Have a valid Manitoba Class 5F driver's licence.
- Meet medical fitness requirements.
- * A previous criminal record does not necessarily mean a person cannot become a correctional officer/juvenile counsellor it will depend on the nature of the offence and how long ago the offence was committed. You may apply for a pardon if you meet the requirements.
