

Visitation Rules

1. Smoking is not permitted on institutional property.
2. Anyone believed to be under the influence of alcohol or drugs will not be permitted to visit.
3. Where it is believed that a visitor committed or tried to commit an illegal act or is in possession of items which are contrary to the provisions of the Criminal Code of Canada, Liquor Control Act or any other legislation the RCMP will be notified.
4. Visiting privileges will be suspended to any visitor who attempts to introduce or remove an unauthorized article to or from the institution.
5. No prescribed medication is allowed in the institution.
6. No food or drink items are to be brought into the institution with the exception of items required for the care of infants.
7. No property is to be brought for the inmate unless pre-approved in advance of the visit; the offender will notify his visitor's of the approval.
8. Leave valuables, tobacco products and personal electronic devices in your vehicles. Outer wear such as coats are to be placed in a locker provided in the visiting area. Visitors are required to show photo ID when asked at the Duty Office and visiting area.
9. Items (such as diaper bags and strollers) that are not placed in the visiting area lockers are subject to search.
10. Visitors should be respectful of other visitors. Disruptive behaviour and loud or offensive language will not be tolerated and will result in the termination of the visit. Also visitors are expected to maintain reasonable control over all children in their care so that their behaviour does not disturb other inmates or visitors.
11. Visitors shall be appropriately dressed for the occasion. Visitors shall not wear clothing that is too tight, low cut, or revealing (i.e. shorts swim suits, beach dress, sheer clothing etc.). Visitors who do not dress properly shall be refused admittance to the visiting area. In addition, footwear (shoes) is mandatory. Inappropriate clothing may also include clothing items that are clearly gang related (i.e. colours); or carry a message or logo that is derogatory or inflammatory (i.e. racial slurs).
12. If determined that a visitor or inmate has been exposing themselves their visiting privileges will be suspended immediately and indefinitely until reinstated by the Superintendent or his designate.
