## Manitoba King's Counsel Appointment

## Information Form

To be appointed King's Counsel a lawyer must:

- 1. Have held a practicing certificate for at least 10 years;
- 2. Demonstrated outstanding practice as a lawyer;
- 3. Acted with integrity throughout their practice; and
- 4. Contributed to the development of excellence in the legal profession through for example, mentorship, legal scholarship, teaching or continuing legal education.

## The application package for King's Counsel appointments must include the following:

- 1. Curriculum Vitae or Resume containing relevant information demonstrating how the nominee meets the eligibility criteria, which can include:
  - The nature of the applicant's practice including, but not limited to, the type of law, and the geographic area involved.
  - Involvement in legal scholarship, teaching and Continuing Legal Education.
  - Involvement in professional organizations including, but not limited to, the Law Society of Manitoba and the Manitoba branch of the Canadian Bar Association.
- 2. Completed Application/Nomination Form
- 3. Completed Authorization Form to the Law Society of Manitoba
- **4.** Two reference letters to assist in determining if a nominee meets the eligibility criteria. Please include the contact information for these individuals:
  - a. One letter is to come from within the Manitoba Bar or Judiciary.
  - b. The second letter is to come from outside the Bar and Judiciary.

**NOTE:** Only two reference letters will be considered and members of the Advisory Committee on King's Counsel Appointments are precluded from being referees.

Applications will be valid for 3 years.
