Application for Child Performer Permit
The Worker Recruitment and Protection Act C.C.S.M. c.W197

1. There is no fee for a permit
2. A child must not directly or indirectly be charged a fee for seeking or finding work
3. A child must not directly or indirectly be charged a fee for auditioning, scouting, recruiting or a referral to another agency or recruiter

Notes

1. A permit does not apply to workplaces where the Alliance of Canadian Cinema, Television and Radio Artists (ACTRA) is the bargaining agent for the child.
2. A permit may include terms and conditions that must be met.
3. The permit may be revoked if the terms and conditions have not been met.

The Worker Recruitment and Protection Act strictly prohibits charging fees to people seeking or finding work
