THIS LICENCE IS ISSUED TO:

CITY OF WINNIPEG; APPLICANT

The following limits, terms and conditions shall be complied with in connection with the operation of a Solid Waste Transfer Station located on Fournier Street in St. Boniface, City of Winnipeg:

1. The applicant shall ensure that construction and operation of the transfer station is in general accordance with the information provided within the Environment Act Proposal and Environmental Impact Assessment Report filed with the Department and dated June 14, 1989.
2. The applicant shall, on completion of the Winnipeg Recycling Feasibility Study, provide information to the Director outlining the scope of recycling to be incorporated into the transfer station and a projected time frame for implementation.
3. The applicant shall ensure that a suitable fence is erected around the property of the transfer station to prevent the spread of litter off the site.
4. The applicant shall ensure that all access roads to and within the transfer station are paved and that appropriate landscaping of the station environs is done.
5. The applicant shall ensure that concrete and heavy construction rubble, excavated fill materials, all liquid wastes, sewage sludges, bulk volumes of rubber tires, hazardous wastes, offal and paunch manure are not handled at the waste transfer station.
6. The applicant shall ensure that burning of any waste does not occur at the transfer station.

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7. The applicant shall ensure that supervisory personnel are on site during operational hours of the transfer station.
8. The applicant shall ensure that scavenging of materials does not occur at the transfer station.
9. The applicant shall ensure that all trailers hauling from the transfer station are covered prior to leaving the station property.
10. The applicant shall implement an ongoing litter pickup program to ensure that the surrounding area and fence of the transfer station are free of litter. The program shall cover a 100 metre buffer zone outside the fence perimeter.
11. The applicant shall provide results from ground water and methane gas monitoring within thirty days of a request from the Director.
12. The applicant shall provide a report to the Director on an annual basis outlining the volume of wastes handled at the transfer station.
