

ITIONS

In this Licence,

"accredited logoratory" means an analytical facility accredited by the Standard Council of Canada SCC), is acceled by another accrediting agency recognized by Manitoba Conservation to be equivalent to the SCC, or be able to demonstrate, upon request, that it has the quarter assurance/quality control (QA/QC) procedures in place equivalent to accreditation band on the international standard ISO/IEC 17025, or otherwise approved by the D ector;

"approved" means approved by the Director or assigned Environment Officer in writing;

"Director" means an employee so designated pursuant to The Environment Act;

"noise nuisance" means an unwanted sound, in an affected area, which is annoying, troublesome, or disagreeable to a person:

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- a) residing in an affected area;
- b) working in an affected area; or

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"Standard Methods for the Examination of Water and Wastewater" means the most recent edition of Standard Methods for the Examination of Water and Wastewater published jointly by the American Public Health Association, the American Waterworks Association and the Water Environment Federation; and

"wastewater" means any liquid containing a pollutant as defined in *The Environment* Act, associated with or resulting from the Development which is discharged in the environment.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITION

This Section of the Licence contains requirements intends to provide puidance to the Licencee in implementing practices to ensure that the province ent is maintained in such a manner as to sustain a high quality of life inclucing solution and economic development, recreation and leisure for present and foure Manitourns.

- 1. The Licencee shall implement a high standart of equipment maintenance and good housekeeping and operational practices with respect to the vevelopment, at all times.
- 2. The Licencee shall reduce the production and dissemination of wastes by initiating and maintaining waste reduction and eastern welling programs.
- 3. In addition to any of the limits, terms of onditions specified in this Licence, the Licencee shall, upon the request of the Director:
 - a) sample, monitor, analyze and or investigate specific areas of concern regarding my segment component or aspect of pollutant storage, containment, treatment, handling, disposal or emission systems, for such pollutants or atoient mality, aquatic toxicity, leachate characteristics and discharge or emission rates, for such duration and at such frequencies as may be specific
 - b) etermine the environmental impact associated with the release of any permant(s) from the Development; or
 - c) prove the Director, within such time as may be specified, with such reports, trawings, specifications, analytical data, descriptions of sampling and malytical procedures being used, bioassay data, flow rate measurements and such other information as may from time to time be requested.
- 4. The Licencee shall, in the event of a release, spill, leak, or discharge of a pollutant or contaminant in an amount or concentration, or at a level or rate of release, that exceeds the limit that is expressly provided under this Act, another Act of the Legislature, or an Act of Parliament, or in a regulation, licence, permit, order, instruction, directive or other approval or authorization issued or made under one of those Acts, immediately report the release, spill, leak, or discharge by calling 204-944-4888. The report shall indicate the nature of the release, leak, or discharge,

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the time and estimated duration of the event and the reason for the release, spill, leak, or discharge.

- 5. The Licencee shall, unless otherwise specified in this Licence:
 - a) carry out all preservations and analyses on liquid samples in accordance with the methods prescribed in the most current edition of "Standard Methods for the Examination of Water and Wastewater" or in accordance with equivalent preservation and analytical methodologies approved by b Director;
 - b) carry out all sampling of, and preservation and analyses (a), son, compost and air samples in accordance with methodologies approved by the Director;
 - c) have all analytical determinations undertaken by an a presided laboratory; and
 - d) report the results to the Director, in writing and in an encironic format acceptable to the Director, within 60 days of the sample being taken.
- 6. The Licencee shall carry out any remedial measures, and fractions, or alterations, as deemed necessary by the Director, in respect to makers an avorized under this Licence.
- 7. The Licencee shall submit all informative required to be provided to the Director under this Licence, in writing, in such form (coluding number of copies) and of such content as may be specified of the Director, and each submission shall be clearly labelled with the Licence Number and the File Number associated with this Licence.
- 8. The Licencee sha oyee, within 30 days of the date of issuance of aesignate this Licence, as e's Environmental Coordinator, whose job description the Lie he Lic neee in complying with the limits, terms and conditions will include assi ence and assising Senior Management of the Licencee to manage in this L the Development. The name of the Environmental enviror inental issues hall be submitted in writing to the Director within 14 days of Coord ator pointn

ZCIFICATIONS, LIMITS, TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Respecting Air Emissions - Limits

- 9. The Licencee shall not emit particulate matter from the Development such that:
 - a) particulate matter:
 - i) exceeds 0.23 grams per dry standard cubic metre calculated at 25 degrees Celsius and 760 millimetres of mercury, corrected to 12 percent carbon dioxide for processes involving combustion, from any point source of the Development;
 - ii) exhibits a visible plume with an opacity of greater than 5 percent at any point beyond the property line of the Development; or

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- iii) results in the deposition of visible particulate residue at any time beyond the property line of the Development; or
- b) opacity from any point source of the Development equals or exceeds:
 - i) 20 percent as the average of any 24 consecutive opacity observations taken at 15 second intervals;
 - 20 percent for more than 16 individual opacity observations within any 1 hour period; or
 - iii) 40 percent for any individual opacity observation.
- 10. The Licencee shall not cause or permit a noise nuisance to be creded as result of the construction, operation or alteration of the Development, and shall take such stars as the Director may require to eliminate or mitigate a noise nuisance.
- 11. The Licencee shall not cause or permit an odour nuisance to be reated as a result of the construction, operation or alteration of the Development, and such take such steps as the Director may require to eliminate or mitige can odour h isance.

Respecting Portable Asphalt Plants

- 12. The Licencee shall not construct, assertion addity, r operate any asphalt plant(s) at the Development unless that aspholt plant(s) has a valid Environment Act Licence authorizing its use.
- 13. The Licence shall not all w any aspher plant(s) to be constructed, assembled, modified, or operated at ne Development unless that asphalt plant(s) has a valid Environment Act Licence athorizing is use.

Respecting Operating Restrictions and Prohibitions

- 14. The License shall not operate, or allow to be operated, any asphalt plant without a pollution control device(s) a the Development.
- 15. The License shall cause operation of any asphalt plant at the Development when the interfor do emirge that the emissions from the asphalt plant are causing a safety concern for received/or highway traffic.
- 10 The Licencee shall cease operation of any asphalt plant at the Development when a Director determines that the emissions from the asphalt plant are creating a sign icant negative environmental or health impact in the affected area.
- 17. The Licencee shall not burn, and/or bury any waste and/or unused material at the Development. Unused material shall not be deposited at the Development except on a temporary basis not exceeding 12 months.
- 18. The Licencee shall dispose of all solid waste generated from any activity at the Development only to a waste disposal ground operating under the authority of a

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permit issued pursuant to Manitoba Regulation 150/91 or any future amendment thereof.

19. The Licencee shall not combust hazardous waste, or allow combustion of hazardous waste, in any asphalt plant at the Development.

Respecting Fugitive Air Pollution Control

20. The Licencee shall control, by methods acceptable to the Director, the entrainment of particulate matter into the air at the Development resulting from the operation of vehicles or the transportation, storage or handling of aggregate or other matrial.

Respecting Contamination from Asphalt or Asphalt Based Maier As

- 21. The Licencee shall, within 60 days of the writter request of the viector, submit a plan:
 - a) to conduct a site assessment at the Davelov ent to ditermine any existing contamination of the soil, surface water or gound enter; and
 - b) to describe measures to be taken to contain and remainate any potential leak or spill which might result from the in operation parage or handling of asphalt or asphalt based material at the Development.

Respecting Chemics storage as Spil Containment

23. The Licencee shell wovide pontainment for all vessels containing chemicals and in each area of the Development where the chemicals are stored, loaded, transferred, used or otherwise has the, in compliance with the National Fire Code of Canada (2010) for an future amendment thereof, such that any product leakage or spillage and any potentiate d liquid generated is contained within the Development and containate of groundwater and surface water is prevented.

Respecting Emergencies

25. The Licencee shall, within 60 days of the issue date of this licence, submit to the Director an emergency response contingency plan in accordance with the Canadian Centre for Occupational Health and Safety emergency planning guidelines.

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REVIEW AND REVOCATION

- A. If in the opinion of the Director, the Licencee has exceeded or is exceeding or has or is failing to meet the specifications, limits, terms or conditions set out in this Licence, the Director may, temporarily or permanently, revoke this Licence.
- B. If, in the opinion of the Director, new evidence warrants a chapter in the specifications, limits, terms or conditions set out in this Licence, the Director may require the filing of a new proposal pursuant to *The Environment Ac*

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
