Re: Eastview Landfill - Notice of Alteration Approval - Environment Act Licence No. 3149 (licence)

Thank you for your notice of alteration dated May 20, 2022. I approve you to burn approximately 44,000 m³ of stockpiled mixed wood wastes following section 14(2) of The Environment Act. I also suspend clause 14 of the licence until December 31, 2022.

In executing this work, the City of Brandon shall:

- 1. complete the burning activities following the December 13, 2021 submission.
- 2. not locate the air curtain burner within:
 - a) 400 metres of a building area not located on the facility site;
 - b) 50 meters of an active area of the landfill; or
 - c) 50 meters of composting area or an area used to collect flammable materials.
- 3. not burn mixed wood wastes unless the burning occurs only:
 - a) in daylight hours;
 - b) under constant supervision; and
 - c) when wind direction and speed will prevent smoke or odour from affecting nearby roads and properties.
- 4. regularly remove ashes from the air curtain burner, once the ashes are completely extinguished, and dispose of ashes in the active cell of an approved landfill.

- 5. not burn any other products or materials, including but not limited to plywood, composite board, or other materials constructed with glues, finishes or preservatives, plastics, composites, rubber, manure, chemically treated fabrics, mattresses, finished furniture, or synthetics.
- 6. keep a burn record at the facility or the premises from which the facility is managed for at least five years, and produce a burn record to the director or an environment officer on request. The burn records shall include the following:
 - a) the date, time, and duration of the burn;
 - b) the volume and types of waste burned;
 - c) the weather conditions during the burn;
 - d) any deviations from normal operations in respect of the burn; and
 - e) any complaints received respecting the burning of waste at the facility.
- 7. submit a notice of alteration to secure approval from the director of the Environmental Approvals Branch before altering the facility.

All other clauses of the licence remain in effect.

The City must run the facility according to all applicable federal, provincial, and municipal regulations and by-laws.

Anyone affected by this decision may appeal the decision to the Minister of Environment, Climate and Parks. Appeals may be submitted in writing to the Minister at <u>minecp@leg.gov.mb.ca</u> by December 16, 2022.
