1. Regulation	
Julia Wiebe, Policy	The PAC agreed to recommend deferring to the General Regulation on the "definitions" of the trade.
Analyst	The PAC reviewed the scope of the trade for skin and nail technician and agreed to recommend incorporating the wording from the Provincial Occupational Analysis.
Updating the trade regulation	The PAC recommends accepting the "General Regulation applies" wording, to be consistent with other trade regulations.

	The PAC recommends accepting the "trade is a compulsory trade" wording, to be consistent with other trade regulations.
	The PAC recommends no changes to the section on "Exclusions."
	After an in-depth discussion in regards to the "Eligibility requirements for apprenticeship," the PAC agreed the requirements remain the same.
	The PAC agreed to recommend accepting the "term of apprenticeship" in language that is consistent with other trade regulations.
	The PAC recommends no changes to the section on "Credit for prior learning."
	The PAC had an in-depth discussion in regards to the "ratio of apprentices to journeypersons" and agreed to recommend increasing the apprentice to journeyperson ratio from 1:1 to 2:1, to make it easier for employers to hire apprentices.
	The PAC agreed to recommend that the trade regulation continue deferring to the General Regulation in regards to the minimum wage rates.
	The PAC recommends the removal of the section on the "Appointment of examiners" because it is an operational rather than a regulatory requirement.
	The PAC recommends deferring to the General Regulation regarding the section on the "Requirement for certificate of qualification."
	The PAC recommends no changes to the sections on the "Authorization to practise" and the "Renewal of authorization."
	The PAC recommends the removal of section 16(3) under "Temporary permits" because the process of undertaking the practical exam has changed and this clause is no longer necessary.



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	 Julia explained the following to the PAC: The Consultation Discussion Guide will be sent to industry stakeholders and current employers of the Industrial Instrument Mechanic trade. The feedback will be provided to the PAC in a Consultation Summary Report to review Once the consultation process is completed: The proposed trade regulation will be brought forward to the Program Standards Committee (PSC) for review If accepted by the PSC, the trade regulation will be forwarded to the ACB for consideration for approval in principle. If approved, the trade regulation will then be directed to Manitoba Justice to be drafted and translated Once translated, the document will be returned to the ACB to be approved and then directed to the Minister for final approval
