2.1 Consultation Guide Review

The Landscape Horticulturist technical training and trade regulation consultation guide was published and distributed to industry stakeholders from January 16, 2018 to February 06, 2018. During that time, four responses were received.

The following comments were submitted as part of the consultation:

- Two responses supported the proposed changes to the technical training and the trade regulation.
- Two responses commented that the three-year program was preferred.

The PAC discussed the comments and reconfirmed the recommendations regarding technical training and the trade regulation. The PAC discussed that the Landscape Horticulturist trade was identified nationally for harmonization by the Canadian Council of Directors of Apprenticeship (CCDA) technical training for review. As part of the initiative, the term of apprenticeship was increased to four levels (1500 technical training/practical hours per level) from three levels (1700 technical training/practical hours per level). It was also noted that existing apprentices will complete the current, three level program while newly registered apprentices will complete four levels once these changes come into force.
