Responsibilities:

The Consortium has a multi-disciplinary range of expertise in areas such as marketing, product development, agricultural production, research, innovation and commercialization.

- The Consortium's role is to:
 - Influence and motivate stakeholders to implement the MPA
 - Leverage relationships with strategic partners such as Protein Industries
 Canada and Western Economic Diversification
 - Advance and evolve the MPA by providing advice to the Minister
 - Provide leadership to the Challenge Dialogue on Sustainable Protein, which will define sustainability and create an action plan for Manitoba
 - Collaborate with the University of Manitoba to develop a Protein Research Strategy
 - Organize a Protein Summit to strengthen synergies among stakeholder groups and report back on the progress made to advance the MPA
 - Act as a reference group for industry, academia and government to support protein industry development
- The Consortium can call upon non-appointed individuals to tackle specific challenges and opportunities.
