Purchased by HBC agent in Honolulu for £520 (\$2,500.00) including a cargo of spars, squared timber & other produce and made seaworthy by coppering (A.11/63 fo. 31 & 19 November; D.7/1 fo. 250-250d)

1852, March Sent to Queen Charlotte Islands with a party of 5 officers and 42 men under Chief Trader John F.

Kennedy to hunt for gold (A.11/73 fo. 332d)

1854-1855 Made voyages to Hawaii with full cargoes which included 18,000 feet of lumber and 421,000 shingles

(W. Kaye Lamb, pp. 51-52; Spoehr).

1857, 19 May Arrived at Victoria from the Sandwich Islands with a small quantity of sugar and molasses and was to be

sent back the end of the month with a mixed cargo (B.226/b/13 fo. 114)

1858, July Fitted up as a guard ship to be stationed in the Fraser River, manned by a draft of 30 officers and men

from the H.M.S. Satellite, to be charged to the public revenue, in order to control the issuing of gold

licences to the miners (B.226/b/15 fo. 69d, 84; B.226/b/16 fo. 86d)

1859, 25 May Sold to the Government but not yet paid for (A.11/77 fo. 242d)

1859, 6 December Mr. Lennard of Lennard & Green of Portland Oregon had recently purchased the brig from the Colony and

requested that the Bill of Sale show it as Orbit to "facilitate his arrangements with the Collector of

Customs". She operated in the Sandwich Island and China trade under Capt. Erskine
