Meet the ELCC Team

This Month's Question

How do I report school-aged children on the Facility Report during the winter break?

Answer

During the winter break, enter school-aged children attendance under the In-services and Holidays category.

The In-services and Holidays category must be used for any non-school days from September 1 to June 30, such as school in-services, winter and spring breaks, recognized holidays, and professional development closure days.

2026 Closure Days

This month, the department sent out a letter to all facilities outlining the recognized holiday schedule for 2026 and three professional development (PD) days for the early learning and child care (ELCC) workforce in the 2026 calendar year.
