<u>Guide to Manitoba Post-Adoption Services – Adult Child of an Adoptee</u> (when Adoptee is Deceased)

The following are the services available to the adult children (18+ years of age) of an adoptee who is deceased and whose adoption was granted in Manitoba:

Non-identifying Social History:

- The adult child is entitled to apply for a Social History. This is background information on the adoptee's birth parents as well as regarding the circumstances of the adoptee's adoption.
- In compliance with Manitoba Legislation, the Social History will not contain any identifying information.
- If the Social History has been previously requested and provided, then a further copy will be shared.

Registering for Contact/Sharing Identifying Information with your parent's Birth Family Members:

- The adult child may register to have contact/share identifying information (i.e. full name and contact information) with their parent's birth parents and birth siblings.
- If a birth family member also registers to have contact/share identifying information with the adoptee, Manitoba Post-Adoption Services will notify them of the adoptee's death and the adult child's interest in contact. If mutually desired Manitoba Post-Adoption Services will facilitate a reunion by assisting both parties in establishing direct contact.

Requesting Search Services for Birth Family Members:

- The adult child may register to have contact/share identifying information as well as have a search conducted for their birth parents and birth siblings of the deceased adoptee.
- Manitoba Post-Adoption Services can only search for birth family members that are named in our records, who are 18+ years of age and who were not previously searched for on behalf of the adoptee.
- A search will not be performed for any person who has filed a Contact/Disclosure Veto or Contact Preference for no contact.
- If a search concludes that the birth parents have been deceased for a year or more or if they would be 101 years of age or older, Manitoba Post-Adoption Services will release the birth parents' identifying information, as per our records, to the adult child of the adoptee.
