Built on a scientific commitment to excellence, this comprehensive document drives exploration, investment and development of our province's rich and diverse mineral resources sector.

For 40 years, in addition to providing a definitive and irreplaceable historic scientific record, the *Report of Activities* delivers an important 'gold mine' of annual geoscientific data from a range of experts.

Laying this important groundwork is no small task. Each year, the Manitoba Geological Survey conducts a wide range of investigations in Manitoba's Precambrian Shield, Western Canada Sedimentary Basin and Hudson Bay Basin, including examination of exposed bedrock, subsurface materials, and surficial sediments (sand, gravel and organic deposits). Information gleaned from these significant scientific endeavours is subsequently embedded in a wealth of accessible data and products including geological maps and reports as well as commodity- or focus-specific webpages and databases, with all publications available for free download from our website.

Manitoba is home to large areas of high mineral potential in remote and relatively under-explored regions. Exploring Manitoba's untapped mineral potential matters today and for tomorrow as the industry depends on the discovery of new deposits to succeed.
