

NOTES

The following comments have been supplied by the Manitoba Forest Service, from whose maps this information has been drawn:

"This area has been ravaged by forest fires for many years. This, plus that fact that a severe climate and possibly poor soil, cause very slow growth, results in very little commercial size timber at the present time.

The map indicates where the best areas of timber are to be found. The species and heights are from photo-interpretation and, while in most cases they are correct, some errors may have been made in species composition or height.

Stands of 30 feet high would yield very little material for construction purposes. Stands of 40 feet high may yield a little small dimension lumber. Stands of 50 feet and over would have good prospects of yielding a fair amount of lumber and some small structural timber.

The principal species throughout the area are Jackpine and Black Spruce with a little White Spruce and small amounts of Aspen and small Birch.

It is possible that some very small stands of good timber may occur, which were too small to outline on the map.

Any amount of fire-wood may be obtained in almost any part of the area."
