

Complainant was subsequently arrested for I.P.D.A. and he alleged that while being arrested and handcuffed his face was delibertly pushed into the side of the pool table. The officers then asked him how he felt now. Allegation : Abuse of authority by using Unnecessary Violence. FORFEITURE OF ONE DAY OFF. No inference to be Reviewed Penalty : drawn from members service records. Reason : Default is of Moderate Gravity Disposition : Dismissed

BOARD HEARING # 5 L.E.R.A. #220 - Complainant Respondent Officers -

85-10-06, Police were called to a disturbance on the street between a brother and sister. Complainant was arrested on the street and he alleges that he was grabbed and thrown against the back of the car and then was handcuffed and thrown into the back seat. On way to the Detox Centre he alleged that the officer sitting beside him punched him in the nose causing it to bleed. The nose was later found to be broken and same required surgery to correct it.

Allegation : Abuse of authority by using Unnecessary Violence.Reviewed Penalty : ONE DAY SUSPENSION WITHOUT PAY. No inferences<br/>to be drawn from memebrs service file.Disposition :Dismissed

<u>BOARD HEARING #6</u> L.E.R.A. #119 - Complainant Respondent Officer -

85-05-31, Officer was performing special duty at a school dance when complainant attended abdrequested entry, he was refused and was physically pushed out of the door. He was denied his explanation that he wished to meet with a teacher friend and colleague who was supervising the dance. He also alleges he was threatened with arrest. <u>Allegation</u>: Abuse of authority by using Cppressive Conduct and being Discourteous and Uncivil.

<u>Reviewed Penalty</u> : ADMCNITION. No inference to be drawn from members service record.

Disposition : Found guilty of committing the alleged Default.

# BCARD HEARING # 7 L.E.R.A. #571 - Complainant Respondent Officers -

85-07-16, Complainant was arrested on an assault charged and alleges that she was taken from her house to the Gruiser Jar without any shoes on, she was not given a chance to call her lawyer and was roughly handcuffed causing pain to her wrists. Mas jushed by one officer and struck in knee by another. Claims she was searched by a female officer which in a way amounted to sexual molestation. Also had her hair pulled by all three officers. She was addressed as a witch and a bitch. Allegation : Abuse of authority by using Unnecessary Violence, Excessive

Force and abusive language.

Reviewed Penalty : 2 members FORFEITURE OF 5 DAYS PAY, 1 member CNE DAY SUSPENSION WITHOUT PAY. No inferences to be drawn on members service records. Disposition : Dismissed-officers exonerated.

BCARD HEARING # 8 Respondent Officer -

85-04-24, Complainant was being pursued by officer's and he ran into the porch of a house and lay down on the floor, on his stomach. The officers were right behind him and one entered the room and before the complainant could get up the officer brought his foot down hard on the Complainants stomach. He was taken to the PSB and complained about pain but was lodged in the P.R.C. and appeared in court later that day, he was released and he started to vomit blood. He was conveyed to the Hospital where he was operated on for a severly damaged pancreas which required a bowel by-pass. A criminal investigation was conducted and reviewed by the A/D/Attorney General with no criminal charges being laid against the officer. <u>Allegation</u>: Abuse of authority by using unnecessary and excessive force. <u>Reviewed Penalty</u>: DISMISSAL. No inferences to be drawn from members service record.

<u>Reason</u>: The seriousness of the allegation would make a lesser penalty inappropriate.

Disposition : Complaint Dismissed - Officer exonerated.

BOARD HEARING # 9

L.E.R.A. #644 - Compleinant Respondent Officer -

86-07-16, Complainant was stopped for making an illegal left turn. The officer instead of just taking her driver's license to his car, took the whole wallet. Complainant discussed this with the officer, which resulted in him stating to her "Listen Baby, I have another ticket to hand out" and he walked away.

<u>Allegation</u> - Abuse of authority by being discourteous, Uncivil & Sexist. <u>Reviewed Penalty</u> : AN ADMONITION. No inferences to be drawn from members service record.

Disposition :

INFORMAL RESOLUTION during the hearing. Sgt. during admitted to Default and was ADMONISHED prior to Hearing date. BOARD HEARING # 10 L.E.R.A. #272 - Complainant Respondent Officer -

86-05-04, Complainant was joy riding with his mother's auto when he was pursued by off duty officer. Complainant was subsequently stopped after a lenghty pursuit. He alleged that he was dragged out of the car by his arm and was thrown to the ground where the officer held him down by placing his knee on his neck. Complainant was allowed to get up, only to be thrown to the ground again and once again the officer placed his knee on his neck.

Allegation : Abuse of authority by using oppressive Conduct and Unnecessary force.

2 DAYS SUSPENSION WITHOUT PAY. No inference to Reviewed Penalty : be drawn from members service record.

Disposition : Not Guilty of Unnecessary Force, Guilty of using oppressive conduct in relation to the chase. This was appealed on a point of law and was ruled in favor of the Officer. The Complainant then appealed that ruling but subsequently withdrew his appeal.

L.E.R.A. #570 - Complainant Respondent Officer -

85-07-18, police responded to a complaint of an arguement, it resulted in the Complainant being charged with Obstructing a Peace Officer. She alleges she was thrown to the ground and roughly handcuffed. At the police station she was grabbed by the hair, pushed into a wall, water was thrown on her and delibertly between the legs to make it appear that she had wet herself.

Allegation : Abuse of authority by using unnecessary violence. Abusive and Cppressive Conduct & Language.

DOARD HEARING # 13 L.C.R.A. #628 -Respondent Officers -

86-05-26, Complainant and friends were walking along the perimeter after an all night bon-fire party on the riverbank. They stopped at the site of a minor accident that involved others that had been at the party. Officer's were in attendance and began to question the by-standers including the complainant, he alleges that for some reason the officer's singled him out, he was held in a choke hold by his jacket and pushed up against the Cruiser Car and hit with a club on the back of his head so that he was knocked out and received a cut to the back of the head that required sutures. Allegation : Abuse of authority by using unnecessary violence. Reviewed Penalty : 5 DAYS SUSPENSION WITHOUT PAY. No inference to be drawn from officers service record. Complaint Dismissed - No evidence called on Disposition : behalf of the complainant.

BCARD HEARING # 14 L.E.R.A. #270 -Respondent Officer -

36-01-01, Police attended a News Eve Party at the request of the Host. Complainant who was in attendance started to argue with the officers. Cn the street he was ordered to move on. He was subsequently arrested and placed in the Cruiser Car. He alleges that on the way to the police station he was punched in the nose causing it to bleed. Upon arrival the same officer grabbed him and threw him to the ground. Allegation : Abuse of authority by using unnecessary violence.

Reviewed Penalty : 1 DAYS SUSPENSION NITHOUT PAY. No inferences to be drawn from members service record. Disposition : Dismissed - Complainat did not appear.

BCARD HELRING # 15

L.E.R.A. #674 -Respondent Officers -

86-10-22, Complainant was walking in a lane off Avenue when he was checked by officers who asked him for I.D., he asked why and was told that he was acting suspicious and he was a criminal and if he said any more he would be locked up and go before a judge in the morning. Complainant was issued with a ticket for not using the sidewalk.

The police also threatened to have his auto towed away as an abandonded vehicle.

This led to a further angry outburst by the compl. who was subsequently arrested for creating a disturbance. In the course of his arrest his face was pushed into the hood of the car and he was kneed in the groin.

<u>Allegation</u>: Abuse of authority by using Unnecessary Violence and Excessive Force. Oppressive and abusive Conduct.

Reviewed Penalty : Oppressive and abusive conduct a WRITTEN REPRIMAND Unnecessary Violence ONE DAY SUSPENSION WITHOUT PAY. No inferences to be drawn from members service record. Disposition : Disciplinary Defaults Dismissed.

BOARD HEARING # 18 L.E.R.A. #720 - Complainant Respondent Officers -

87-01-08, Complainant was issued with an offence notice for obstructing

traffic. At the Court case the Complainant alleged that the officers made untrue statements as to obscenities uttered by him. Complainant later found these allegations were contained in notes made by the officers, on the back of the offence notice. έų

be police officer who identified himself and accused the Complainant of shoplifting. Complainant tried to explain that he was only pretending to pick up the articles so as to throw a suspect off guard. Officer left and returned 4 hrs later, in uniform and arrested the complainant and charged him with theft. Complainant as a result of this lost his job. Charge was never authorized by the Crown.

<u>Allegation</u>: Abuse of authority by making an arrest without Reasonable and Probable grounds, also using Oppressive and Abusive Conduct.

BOARD HEARING # 21

Complainant was advised by his wife that the same two officers had attended the house four times earlier that evening and on one occassion entered and searched the house for him, without a warrant.

On 88-11-08, Commissioner Deporcq advises that Complainant has withdrawn her request for a hearing. Reason being she cannot afford legal counsel and dos'nt qualify for Legal Aid.




