Manitoba Building Code Updates

Accessibility





Background

- Effective January 1, 2024, Manitoba will be adopting the 2020 edition of the National Building Code of Canada (NBC) published by the National Research Council (NRC).
- In coordination with Manitoba's Canadian Free Trade Agreement (CFTA) partners, the national model codes are now freely available online through the NRC's website: https://nrc.canada.ca/en/certifications-evaluations-
 - standards/codes-canada/codes-canada-publications.
- The 2020 NBC is adopted with amendments under the Manitoba Building Code (MBC) regulation which is available on the Manitoba Laws website:

2020 NBC - Accessibility

- The 2015 and 2020 editions of the NBC substantially updated and reorganized accessibility requirements with 66 sets of technical changes representing the first major update since the 1980s.
- While the 2020 NBC accessibility requirements are not identical to Manitoba's previous amendments, the changes substantially update accessibility requirements to accommodate building use for a broad range of mobility devices and persons aging in place, as well as harmonize with the CSA B651, Accessible Design for the Built Environment standard.



2020 NBC - Accessibility

- To address the differences between Manitoba's previous requirements and the NBC, updated regulations adopt the 2020 NBC requirements but carry over three amendments which:
 - expand the use of visual signal devices;
 - require handrails on both sides of stairways and ramps; and
 - address application of some requirements to existing buildings.



Code Development

Under CFTA commitments Manitoba adopts the national model construction codes and is limited in its ability to make amendments.
