The following Bill was read a First Time and had its purposes outlined:

(No. 210) – The Indigenous Veterans Day Act (Commemoration of Days, Weeks and Months Act Amended)/Loi sur la Journée des anciens combattants autochtones (modification de la Loi sur les journées, les semaines et les mois commémoratifs)

(MLA PANKRATZ)

Hon. Ms. SMITH, the Minister of Housing, Addictions and Homelessness, made a statement regarding National Addictions Awareness Week, November 24 to 30, 2024.

Mrs. HIEBERT commented on the statement.

Pursuant to sub-rule 28(1), Hon. Ms. SMITH, Mr. WOWCHUK, MLA LOISELLE, Mr. JACKSON and Hon. Min. MOROZ made Member's statements.

The following petitions were presented and read to the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba:

Mrs. COOK – To urge the Provincial Government to proceed with the planned renovation and expansion of Phoenix School without further delay.

Mr. JACKSON – To urge the Minister of Education and Early Childhood Learning to reverse recent amendments to the Teaching Certificates and Qualifications Regulation that weaken subject-area requirements for teacher certification, and to reinstate teachable majors and minors and early-middle years requirements, which are essential for ensuring teachers have strong knowledge in core subject areas; and to urge the Provincial Government to address teacher shortages through alternative measures that uphold rigorous subject-area standards, which are critical for providing quality education to all Manitoba students.

Mr. NARTH – To urge the Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure to prioritize the reconstruction of Provincial Road 210; and to urge the Provincial Government to include the stretch of Provincial Road 210 from Woodridge to Highway 12 in its reconstruction plans.

The House resumed the debate on the proposed motion of MLA COMPTON:

THAT the following address be presented to Her Honour the Lieutenant Governor:

We, the Members of the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba, thank Your Honour for the gracious speech addressed to us at this Second Session of the Forty-Third Legislature of Manitoba.

And the proposed amendment moved by Mr. EWASKO as follows:

THAT the motion be amended by adding at the end the following words:

But this House regrets that the Provincial Government has failed to follow through on its commitments to the people of Manitoba, demonstrating a lack of credibility, integrity and competence in basic governance, and has thus neglected the needs of Manitobans.

As a consequence of this and many other failings, the Provincial Government has thereby lost the trust and confidence of the people of Manitoba and this House.

And the debate continuing on the amendment,

And MLA LOISELLE, Mr. JACKSON, Mrs. SCHOTT, Ms. BYRAM, Messrs. BRAR, PERCHOTTE, OXENHAM and NARTH, MLA REDHEAD and Mrs. HIEBERT having spoken,

The debate was allowed to remain open.

The House then adjourned at 5:00 p.m. until 1:30 p.m. Tuesday, November 26, 2024.
