The Whiteshell Colony has filed a proposal pursuant to *The Environment Act* for an alteration to the existing wastewater treatment lagoon located in the southeast quarter of Section 33-12-11 EPM in the Rural Municipality of Whitemouth. The proposed alteration is to construct a discharge pipe and gate valve at the secondary cell to allow for the option to discharge treated effluent via trickle discharge to an existing ravine which discharges to the Whitemouth River between June 15<sup>th</sup> and October 31<sup>st</sup> of any year. The lagoon is currently licensed for discharge of treated effluent via irrigation by injection onto agricultural land.
