OVERVIEW:

Manitoba Conservation and Climate received a Proposal on November 30, 2020 for the operation of a household hazardous waste collection, storage, and transfer depot (the Facility) located at the Manipogo Provincial Park on portions of NW 29-29-15 WPM, in the Province of Manitoba. The Facility accepts and stores single use compressed gas cylinders. The hazardous wastes are transported from this Facility to a licensed facility for further processing, reuse, or disposal. No hazardous waste is disposed of at this location.

The Department, on February 1, 2021, placed copies of the Proposal in the Public Registries located at Legislative Library (200 Vaughan Street), and online at https://www.gov.mb.ca/sd/eal/registries/6093/application.pdf. Copies of the Proposal were also provided to the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) members. A notice of The Dangerous Goods Handling and Transportation Act proposal was placed in the Dauphin Herald on February 2, 2021. The newspaper and TAC notifications invited responses until March 2, 2021.

 Municipal Relations requires to add language that reflects a requirement for compliance with the Manitoba Fire Code to ensure proper storage and safety plan requirements.

Disposition:

Clause 25 of the draft licence addresses storage compliance to Manitoba Fire Code.

PUBLIC HEARING:

As no requests were received for a public hearing, a public hearing is not recommended.

CROWN-INDIGENOUS CONSULTATION:

The Government of Manitoba recognizes that it has a duty to consult in a meaningful way with Indigenous communities when any proposed provincial law, regulation, decision or action may infringe upon or adversely affect the exercise of the Indigenous rights of that community.

This project is located on a property owned and operated by the applicant and located within a provincial park. All surrounding land(s) potentially affected is privately owned. The project will not affect resources available for use on land or water. Since resource use is not affected by the project, there would be no infringement of Indigenous rights under Section 35 of The Constitution Act, 1982. Therefore, it is concluded that Crown-Indigenous consultation is not required for the project.

RECOMMENDATION:

The provincial Technical Advisory Committee expressed no concerns, or concerns are addressed in the draft licence, regarding the proposal. The Proponent should be issued a Licence for the operation of a household hazardous waste collection, storage, and transfer depot in accordance with the specifications, limits, terms, and conditions of the attached draft Licence. Enforcement of the Licence should be assigned to the Western Region of the Environmental Compliance and Enforcement Branch.
