Environment, Climate and Parks, Environmental Compliance and Enforcement Branch has reviewed the above noted Environment Act Proposal, and submit the following comments.

The proponent has indicated that treated wastewater effluent from the Selkirk Wastewater Treatment Plant will be used as process water for the proposed manufacturing facility. What are the potential impacts to staff and operations should effluent quality parameters exceed those of the Industrial Service Agreement and/or the requirements of Environment Licence 3273 issued to the City of Selkirk. Furthermore, should exceedances occur, what mitigation or contingency measures are proposed.

The updated air quality assessment report indicates that the dispersion modelling assessment predicted no exceedances of the MAAQC for all parameters and locations. Contrary to this Table 18 of this report identifies an exceedance of the MAAQC for the NO2-TCM for both the 1-hour and 24-hour maximum acceptable level

concentrations. Please clarify why this hasn't been identified as an exceedance, or what mitigation measures will be implemented to ensure compliance with these thresholds.

Capital Region:

Based on the provided EAP in which the applicant indicates they will discuss the Traffic Impact Study and Drainage Study with MTI to ensure all MTI needs are met prior to construction, I have no concerns with the proposed. Approval from MTI must be received prior to any construction that may impact the MTI network and is required for any drainage into MTI ditches, upgrades to MTI roadways, and construction within the 38.1 m Controlled Areas of PTH 4 and PTH 9, as well as the 304.8 m Controlled Area Circle of the PTH 4 and PTH 9 intersection. In particular MTI/TSE would like to review the drainage study to ensure no MTI impacts.

Roadside Development:

A traffic impact study has been prepared and is presently undergoing review. Please note the following statutory requirements for PTH 4.

Statutory Requirements:

Under the Transportation Infrastructure Act, a permit is required from Manitoba Transportation and Infrastructure to construct, modify, relocate, remove or intensify the use of an access. A permit is also required from Manitoba Transportation and Infrastructure to construct, modify or relocate a structure or sign, or to change or intensify the use of an existing structure (including the alteration of existing buildings) within the 38.1 (125ft) controlled area from the edge of the highway right-of-way.

In addition, a permit is required from the Manitoba Transportation and Infrastructure for any planting placed within 15 m (50 ft) from the edge of the right-of-way of this highway.

Further to your e-mail regarding the above noted application, the Manitoba Historic Resources Branch (HRB) has examined the location in conjunction with Branch records for areas of potential concern.

The proponent submitting an advanced heritage screening, an heritage resource protection plan will be implemented, and no new heritage resources have not been reported since the initial screening.

The potential to impact to heritage resources is believed to be low based on analysis of <u>current data</u> and evaluated by the type of action proposed, therefore, the HRB has no concerns with the proposed project at this time. This evaluation is only appropriate for this respective request.

Legislation

Under Section 46 and 51 of the Heritage Resources Act (the Act), if at any time, heritage resources are encountered in association with these lands during testing and development, there is an obligation to report any heritage resources and a prohibition on destruction, damage or alteration of said resources. HRB may require that an acceptable heritage resource management strategy be implemented by the proponent/developer to mitigate the effects of their activity on the heritage resources.
