Concerns:

Further to your e-mail regarding the above noted application, the Manitoba Historic Resources Branch (HRB) has examined the locations in conjunction with Branch records for areas of potential concern. Notably, there are concerns with the current proposed plan to impact potential heritage resource sites. The proposed water pipelines and irrigated fields are in close proximity to elevated terrain along the Assiniboine River. The Assiniboine, and the tributaries that form its watershed, have a number of known archaeological sites along and near the margins, including large Pre-European contact Indigenous campsites, Bison Kill sites, Fur Trade Posts, and Pre-European contact and Historic burial locations. These factors, to name a few, suggest that any planned development within the area has the potential to impact heritage resources, therefore, the Historic Resources Branch has concerns with the project at this time.

Legislation

Under Section 12(2) of The Heritage Resources Act (the Act), if there is reason to believe that heritage resources or human remains upon or within or beneath lands are likely to be damaged or destroyed by any work, activity, development or project, then the Minister may require a proponent to apply for a heritage permit and conduct at his/her own expense, a heritage resource impact assessment (HRIA) and mitigation, prior to the project's start. As per sections 46 and 51 of the Act, there is an obligation to report any heritage resources and a prohibition on destruction, damage or alteration of said resources. A Heritage Resource Impact Assessment (HRIA) is an assessment showing the impact that proposed work is likely to have upon heritage resources or human remains. HRIAs must be conducted by a qualified archaeological consultant under a heritage permit. Please find attached a flow chart outlining the general process of an HRIA.

HRIA Expectations

- 1. Systematic pedestrian survey and judgemental shovel testing of the water pipeline route and water intakes based on in-field observations and assessment of footprint, to identify the presence and extent of heritage resources along these routes and to determine if further mitigation is required, within the following sections:
 - a. 18-09-09-W1
 - b. 08-09-09-W1

- 2. If the identified irrigation fields require ground disturbance (i.e. native vegetation clearing, slope modification and landscape leveling, etc.) in order to facilitate the installation and operation of the centre pivot irrigation systems, then an HRIA will be required for the areas in which this ground disturbing activities will occur. Subsurface testing and pedestrian survey will be expected for these areas in following quarter-sections if this is to occur:
 - a. NW-08-9-9-W1

Other Recommendations

Please Implement an HRPP.

We recommend a heritage resource protection plan (HRPP) be included in planning and construction in the event heritage resources (including human remains and palaeontological resources) are accidentally encountered. The HRPP consists of operational procedures to limit damage or destruction of heritage resources accidentally found during site work. This document assists informing managers, employees, contractors on what to do and whom to call should heritage resources accidentally be encountered when testing and development is underway on site.

Please find attached an archaeological consultants' list for reference, a Heritage Resources Protection Plan (HRPP) template that proponents/contractors/operators can use as a guide, as well as a fact sheet outlining the legal provisions involving found human remains. Due diligence should be conducted in order to assess quotes, services, and timelines. If you have any questions, please contact as above for proper assignment and queueing.

Western Regional Operations:

1. MTI would like to advise that, when the irrigation pivots are installed in section 8-9-9WPM. That they are placed/set in a manner that the spray from the irrigation system does not reach the road surface of Provincial Road (PR) 242.

- 2. If construction activities require the need to construct a new access, modify an existing, intensify its use or relocate an existing access connection onto PR 242, the proponent should be informed that, under the Transportation Infrastructure Act, a permit will be required from Manitoba Transportation and Infrastructure (MTI). A permit may also be required for:
 - a. Any construction (above or below ground level) within 38.1 m (125 ft) from the edge of right-of-way of PR 242;
 - b. Any plantings within 15.2 m (50 ft) from the edge of right-of-way of PR 242;
 - c. Discharge of water or other liquid materials into the ditch of PR 242.

3. For any Utility Installations within the right-of-way of PR 242, the proponent should be informed that, under the Transportation Infrastructure Act, a permission/agreement will be required from MTI before works may commence.

We note that there are 4 existing access connections to PR 242 from this property. We would like to see the landowner remove some of the accesses. If this is possible, we would waive the permit fee for the removals. Is this something that can be added to as condition of the licence?

 In reference to 2.2.6 of the Report, a separate application must be made to Manitoba Environment, Climate and Parks for the tile drainage permit(s) to allow for the improved drainage of the irrigated fields in Section 8-9-9 W1

- Under the Drainage of Canada Land Inventory (CLI) Soil Capability for Agriculture (1965) Class 6 and 7 and unimproved organic soils cannot be approved for drainage (this includes the installation of tile drainage).
 - It has been determined there works proposed on Class 6 soils and the onus is on the applicant to demonstrate that the area being drained is not class 6 as substantiated with a pedologist's report.
- Authorization cannot be provided for works that will result in the loss or alteration of a Class 4 or Class 5 wetland; please note that the proposed irrigation pivot track looks to go through a minimum Class 4 wetland in NW 8-9-9w.
