## Campground Tips

- Be Wildlife Smart. Do not feed any wildlife, including birds or squirrels. You are in black bear country - secure all attractants such as food, cooking equipment and trash in a locked vehicle. Do not store food or attractants in your tent.
- Practice Leave No Trace. Pack out all gear and trash to keep the campsites clean for others.
- Keep dogs on leash and clean up after your pet.
- Learn to recognize and avoid poisonous plants such as poison ivy.
- Open fires are prohibited. Use portable stoves or fire pits provided.
- Don't Move Firewood - Moving firewood can spread harmful invasive species and destroy our forests.
- Prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species. Always clean, drain, dry watercraft and water related equipment. Visit [manitoba.ca/stopais](http://manitoba.ca/stopais) for full regulations.
- In case of injury or illness contact a Park Attendant or Park Patrol Officer. They can assist you to reach medical help.

## Big Whiteshell Lake Campground

- Fabulous fishing opportunities in crystal clear waters



**B**ig Whiteshell Lake campground is just that - big - with four sections and 78 sites for your enjoyment. A playground, tennis court and amphitheatre are also part of this campground in spectacular Whiteshell Provincial Park. The boat launch and dock are conveniently located within the campground.

Take a walk on the Big Whiteshell Hiking trail, a total length of 1.6 kilometers. Whether you are a novice or experienced hiker, you will observe magnificent views and perhaps some wildlife. The park is home to a variety of animals from porcupines to pelicans. Bring along your bike and travel the newly developed nine kilometer, round-trip Big Whiteshell mountain bike trail.

Big Whiteshell Lake is perfect for swimming and boating. Attention anglers: the lake is also well known for fabulous fishing in crystal clear waters teeming with fish. Bring your tackle box and rod and try your luck at walleye, northern pike, smallmouth bass or yellow perch.

Big Whiteshell Lake Campground is located just off Provincial Road # 307 on Provincial Road # 309.
