RE: Site Remediation - Stage 1 & 2 Canadian Tire Property, Brandon, MB Our Project No. E238 & 239

Please be advised that the vapour extraction system for stage 1 has been put into operation around the Canadian Tire store since December 3, 1990. A total of 59 vapour extraction wells and 4 vapour extraction units are used for stage 1.

For the stage 2 site remediation, approximately 70% of the trenching and piping are now complete. A total of 70 vapour extraction wells and 2 large diameter product recovery wells have been installed as of December 3, 1990. Two vapour extraction units have been hooked up to Trench No. 3 West, 4 & 5 (near the southerly portion of the Canadian Tire Gas Bar & the south parking lot) and in operation since December 4, 1990. A third vapour extraction unit is expected to be hooked up to Trench No. 3 east and 2 east very shortly.

Due to the present extremely cold weather and the depth of the frozen soils encountered at the site, it is not considered practical to continue the trenching for the remainder of Trench No. 1 and 2. The outstanding trenching work of stage 2 will be done in the Spring of 1991.

All the 129 wells and the vapour extraction units of stage 1 @ 2 will be monitored monthly by our firm for the next 12 months, to catisfactory performance from an environmental ensure a standpoint.

Site Remediation - Stage 1 & 2
Canadian Tire Property, Brandon, MB
Our Project No. E238 & 239

- 1) Drilling of the vapour extraction wells for both Stage 1 & 2 (total 129 wells) has been completed by Paddock Drilling since November 14, 1990.
- 2) Installation of the vapour extraction systems Stage 1 has been virtually completed by Maple Leaf Enterprises Ltd, since November 22, 1990. The south trench and about 170' of the east portion of the northeast trench had been patched with cold mix asphalt. The outstanding work of Stage 1 includes installation of the vent pipes and hooking up of the 4 vapour extraction units. This outstanding work is supposed to be done on November 27 & 28, 1990. However, the owner, Mr. VanLinge of Maple Leaf Enterprises had an accident on November 26, 2990. As such, the said work is presently suspended. It is planned that the remainder of the Stage 1 work be completed late this week or by the 1st week of December 1990.
- 3) All components of the 8 vapour extraction units for Stage 1 & 2 have been ordered. Six units are already in our laboratory. The remaining two are expected to arrive next week. On site electrical wiring for our 8 vapour extraction units by GT Smith of Brandon is 90% complete.
- 4) The design drawing, plate 1 and cross sections, plate 2 & 3 for both the Stage 1 & 2 site remediation have been completed and are enclosed. The layout of the various systems for Stage 1 & 2 was finalized by the writer in mid November during his inspection of the Stage 1 site remediation work in Brandon. Special considerations were made in the layout so that disturbance to the existing buried services and inconvenience to the Canadian Tire customers is minimized.

5) The Stage 2 site remediation commenced on November 21, 1990. The work was undertaken by Cumming & Dobbie personnel in two shifts (i.e. day and night shifts supervised by our field engineers, Rob Kupchak and Harley Pankratz, respectively). Approximately 1600' of asphalt (the entire trench No. 5 and one half of trench No.3 & 4) had been cut by a road saw using the dry cutting method.

Indicated in "green" on the design drawing is the total length of header pipes and trenches (about 550') completed for Stage 2, as of November 26, 1990. Please note that trench No. 1 to 5 are for Stage 2.

Heavy snow fall and freezing temperatures since November 24, 1990 have hampered the trenching progress. The depth of frost penetration as of November 26, 1990 at the site was about 20". The frozen soils had caused equipment break down a couple of times. It is now considered essential that a frost ripper be utilized to break and remove the frozen soils. In this regard, a 4 man crew (i.e. our field engineer, 1 large backhoe equipped with a frost ripper, and an operator, one small backhoe with an operator and a laborer) will be mobilized per shift, effective on the afternoon of November 27, 1990.

Depending on the upcoming weather and due to the working time restrictions and cold mix asphalt requirements imposed by the store owner, Mr. Merv Dillabough, it is very likely that all 5 trenches under Stage 2 cannot be completed economically this year. It is hoped that trench 5, 4 and 3 can be completed by early December, leaving trench 1 and 2 to be done in late spring of 1991. If this is the case, we shall require temporary storage space for the surplus piping and styrofoam insulation over the winter. In this regard, we shall have further comments at a later date.

6) The two recovery wells (one each near MW13 & MW2) had been installed by Subterranean (Manitoba) Ltd., during the period between November 26 & 27, 1990. Arrangements will be made to remove the liquid gasoline from the two wells with an approved septic truck, for disposal at the approved landfill site in Brandon.



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- 7) Initial soil gas measurements for all 129 wells installed for Stage 1 & 2 had been undertaken by our field engineers, using both the hydrocarbon surveyor and the Gastec gasoline detection tubes. These initial measurements show that the wells installed around the Canadian Tire Gas Bar consistently contain flammable gasoline vapours in excessive of the lower explosive limit of 11,000 ppm. These exceptionally high gasoline vapours are likely related to the gasoline spill reported on the evening of September 22, 1989 at the Canadian Tire Gas Bar. According to the documents obtained by the writer from the Brandon Fire Department, the leak occurred in the second storage tank (Serial No. B 35827C) from the south. Further details on the leak can be found in the following documents enclosed:
- 7.1 Brandon Fire Department letter dated October 3, 1989.
- 7.2 Two notes for file dated September 23, 1989 by A.J. Ryan, fire inspector of City of Brandon and the attached sketch showing the leaky tank.

We shall have further comments on this issue, once all the field data from the new wells are analyzed in more detail.

- 8) Documents obtained by the writer from the Brandon Fire Department indicate that there had been several major spills of gasoline, diesel fuel, fuel oil at the Petro-Canada property between February 23, 1981 and August 18, 1983 as follows:
- 8.1 February 23, 1981: an undisclosed amount of gasoline spilled inside the dyke around a 95,000 gallon storage tank (see Brandon Fire Department Report #98 attached)
- 8.2 March 27, 1981: an undetermined amount of gasoline spilled on the ground around a 14,500 gallon storage tank (see Brandon Fire Department Report #176)
- 8.3 March 10, 1982: Approximately 317 gallons of gasoline leaked to the ground from a storage tank without a dyke (see Brandon Fire Department report dated March 11, 1982, separate report #172 and additional information by Capt. R. Dean & Lt. M. Phinney).

- 8.4 October 20, 1982: Approximately 1900 gallons of diesel fuel spilled inside a dyked tank (See Brandon Fire Department report dated October 20, 1982 and related correspondence attached).
- 8.5 August 18, 1983: A large amount of fuel oil had spilled down from the top of a 20,000 gallon tank. About 500 to 800 gallons of fuel oil were lost (see Brandon Fire Department Report dated August 18, 1983).

In our opinion, the above reported hydrocarbon spills are at least partly responsible for the high volatile hydrocarbon vapours detected in the Canadian Tire property, especially the area located on the north side of the existing Canadian Tire store. The diesel fuel encountered in MW22 is considered to have been migrated from the Petro-Canada compound into the Canadian Tire property.

It is interested to note that gasoline odour was discovered by ICG of Brandon during their digging at the <u>north</u> property line of Canadian Tire, at location of the lateral gas main which lead to the Canadian Tire store, and that a soil sample taken from the said pit and tested by Manitoba Environment showed extractable gasoline concentration of 8600 ppm which was 10% over the safety limit (see Brandon Fire Department Notes for file dated March 7, 1990, April 5, 1990). The presence of gasoline saturated subsoils reported by ICG of Brandon is consistent with the findings of our environmental site assessment undertaken in the region for Canadian Tire, during the period from October 1989 to May 1990.

It should be noted that there is no record of newer hydrocarbon spills in the file of the Brandon Fire Department, after the reported 800 gallon fuel oil spill at the Petro-Canada property on August 18, 1983.

Our recent site observations have indicated that there is evidence of surface spills of hydrocarbons near the tank farm and the loading racks inside the Petro-Canada compound. Due to the ground water flow direction and the sandy soil conditions, any hydrocarbon spills at the Petro-Canada compound can migrate into the Canadian Tire property.





RE: Underground Gasoline Storage Tanks at Canadian Tire - 1655 - 18th St.

The writer witnessed the installation of 4 - 5000 gallon fiberglass underground storage tanks at the above address.

The tanks were installed by Canadian Tire personnel and supervised by Frank O'Grady, Project Supervisor Construction, Real Estate and Engineering in a good workmanship manner and in conformance with Section 4 of the Manitoba Fire Code.

The serial numbers of the tanks are B35861C, B35827C, B35927C, B35925C. Results of hydrostatic tests are attached.

Periodic inspections were made on August 22nd through September 28th, 1989 and all conditions appeared satisfactory.

Jim Hodge of A & J Pump Service phoned on Friday evening September 22nd, 1989, stating there was a leak in one of the tanks which was discovered during hydrostatic test.

I went to investigate at 1900 hours and witnessed leak, which was approximately 16" down from top of tank. Mr. Merv Dillabough (Manager of Canadian Tire) was contacted and arrangements were made to have gasoline removed from tank to a point below the leak.

Arrangements were made with C.A.E. Fiberglass Ltd. to have tank repaired.

Tank was repaired on Sunday morning, September 24th, 1989 and hydrostatic test proved satisfactory.

NOTE FOR FILE
September 23rd, 1989

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Jim Hodge of A & J Pump Service phoned on Friday evening stating there was a leak in one of the tanks at Canadian Tire.

I went to investigate at 1900 hours and examined the leak which was approximately 16" down from the top of tank.

Project supervisor, Frank O'Grady had left town in route to Toronto so I contacted Mr. Merv Dillabough (Store Manager).

Mr. Dillabough arrived at store at approximately 2000 hours and arrangements were made to have a truck from Texaco to come and pump off gasoline down below the leak.

Dave Sukaroff from Texaco arrived at approximately 2200 hours and proceeded to pump off tank.

I asked Dave to cover hole with a piece of burlap and P.gravel before he left at which time I left for home.

I phoned Mr. John Duncan C.A.E. Representative from Winnipeg at approximately 2230 hours, and John stated that if the hydrostatic tests were performed at a maximum 5 p.s.i. this leak could be repaired without too much problem.

Deputy Chief Winters and myself went and inspected tanks at 0930 hours September 30th/89 and met Jim Hodge on site. Jim informed us that he had a call from C.A.E. representative from Edmonton and he was flying in today and the leak would be repaired on Sunday October 1st/89.

I called Maurice Mazzerolle for information regarding removing the tank from ground, in conformance with Subsection 4.3.17.3.(1) of Fire Code and he stated that this was intended for existing storage tanks, and if tank was repaired by C.A.E. personnel and the tank passed the hydro test, this would be acceptable.

A letter of certification will be required from the C.A.E. representative.

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#### NOTE FOR FILE

September 23rd, 1989 1655 - 18th Street Brandon, Manitoba 1430 Hours

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Received a call from Tim Hodge of A & J Pump Service that he had a small flash fire while performing a hydrostatic test on underground gasoline storage tanks at Canadian Tire. Fire was extinguished immediately by Tim but he asked me to attend.

I called Capt. McEachen and asked him to meet me at the scene and to bring the camera with him.

I arrived on scene at 1440 hours and Capt. McEachen arrived shortly after.

Tim Hodge stated that his helper Darryl Tandoni was draining gasoline from bleeder pipe attached to the top of tank fill pipe into a plastic pail, when gasoline in pail suddenly ignited, slightly burning his hands and he threw the pail away from himself. Fire was quickly extinguished by Tim Hodge and no damage was caused.

Darryl Tandoni stated that he had been getting shocks in his hands for quite some time during the day and stated that he was wearing a woolen sweater. He took the sweater off and the static electricity was eliminated.

Therefore, it would appear that as Darryl was bleeding gasoline from the filler pipe into the plastic pail, a static spark passed from his fingers to the pail or gasoline causing a flash fire.

Photographs were taken and I returned home at 1530 and Capt. McEachen returned to hall.

## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Received call of a fuel oil spill at 18th Street Gulf Oil of Canada. On arrival found a large amount of fuel oil had spilled down from the top of a 20,000 gallon tank which there was a miscalcuation on what the tank would hold as to what was on the tanker truck which was pumping into it. Clarks Septic Tank and A. J. Pump Service along with the Environmental Department from Winnipeg were called into rectify this problem. Two men from Winnipeg arrived at approximately 0530 hours. With the advice of them and also Assistant Manager Ken Melvin of Gulf Oil, the piercing nozzle was utilized to flush the gravel in the moat which had been saturated with fuel oil. 1500 gallons of water was used to flush and neutralize the oil. Clarks Septic Tank Service then loaded the oil and water to take to the City Dump. It is assumed that from 500 to 800 gallons were lost. As far as can be determined, Gulf Oil is responsible and Nottri-Mac Trucking. The driver from Trimac Trucking was S.W. Tanner, Box 75, Griswold, Manitoba (Tanker No. 73525).

Responded to spill at the Gulf bulk plant 18th & Richmond Avenue with J. Ryan. On arrival the pumper from #2 Fire Station was washing down a fuel oil spill inside a dyked tank. H. Ball was syphoning the spill into his septic tank truck.

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Bryan Durupt from Environmental Control (Winnipeg) was on the scene.

The Gulf plant manager stated he had called Environmental Control but had not called this department as he felt there was no danger to a spill of fuel oil. He stated a driver from Trimac, Grant Girbus, had been filling the wrong tank. Since the tank was on the far side of the area, he did not see the fuel oil running over. The tank he was filling was already partially filled and hence approximately 1900 gallons spilled onto the ground.

On arrival and information received from Gulf was that a Trimac driver pumped from his tank truck and overfilled a new storage tank, spilling approximately 300 gallons of gasoline. Gulf had phoned Clark's Septic Service and arrived on the scene approximately 1630 hours to take off the excessive gasoline that had gone into a low area of ground. Stood by with a charged hand line ready in case of accidental ignition or static ignition, while Clark's Septic Service was sucking up the gasoline. There was no dike around the storage tank in question.

Capt. R. Dean and Inspector J. Ryan were at the scene.

Brian Durupt of the Environmental Department was in Neepawa when the head office notified him of the problem. He arrived on the scene at approximately 1725 hours and took control of the gasoline spill at that time.

Brian Durupt and Capt. R. Dean (Inspector) of the Brandon Fire Department talked the situation over, and decided that the problem was not that hazardous and that Gulf could wait until Thursday morning to have the spill cleaned up and left in a safe condition.



As you are aware, the stage 2 site remediation of your property will be managed by Geokwan Environmental Ltd., with the equipment and labour being supplied by Cummings & Dobbie of Brandon.

Asphalt cutting using 2 separate crew and a <u>dry</u> method will start tomorrow, November 22, 1990. We have been advised by the supplier of pavement saw blades in Winnipeg that where possible, water should be used to cut asphalt, to avoid problems (see attached letter). To satisfy your requirements, we will start with dry cutting. However, if there are lots of cutting problems, we will have to get your permission to use water in the <u>less critical areas</u> (i.e. the areas away from the northwest quadrant of the parking lot).

There will be two crew, each working on a 10 hour shift (9 p.m. to 7 a.m. and 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.) per day. After completion of the northwest quadrant of the parking lot, the night shift hours may be changed to 5 p.m. to 3 a.m. or so. At present, the day and night crew will be headed by our field engineers, Robert Kupchak B.Sc.(GE) and Harley Pankratz P. Eng., respectively. They are staying at the Colonial Inn in Brandon.

As discussed with Mr. Cruse today, shipments of the styrofoam insulation and PVC pipes will be arriving on the evening of November 21 and 22, 1990, respectively. The above noted cable was cut in the zone of frozen soils at about 14" from grade by the excavation crew last night. About 5' of the affected trench excavation is presently left open and surrounded with barricades.

Will you please visit the site as soon as possible and give the writer an estimate of the cable repair. We wish to see the cable fixed today, if possible. If you have any questions, please contact our field engineer, Rob Kupchak who is presently working at the south parking lot.
